

Project News

This month begins the busiest time in the Puyallup Lions calendar year. The Christmas Tree Sale starts the Saturday after Thanksgiving and will continue until we are sold out. Prices will remain the same as last year as will the hours we are open. Help is needed by all of our members available to ensure a successful project.

This is our longest continuing project. It traces its origins back to the early 1960's when we would get trees in a bundle of 3-5 from Kirk's. We have had a stable tree source for the last several years but our supplier is selling out after this season so we may need to look for another wholesaler to purchase trees from.

On the Friday after Thanksgiving we will be setting up the lot beginning at 10 am. We tow the trailer down and set up all of the stands, repairing those that need it. Then the next morning we will be getting a truckload of Trees around 9am to unload and set trees out in the lot. We hope to have the Boy Scouts assist us again in unloading but will need all capable hands out to ensure the success. Trees will start selling at noon on Saturday. Hours of operation are 10-7 weekdays and 9-8 on Weekends. Shifts for our workers are M-F 5pm-7pm and weekends from 9-12, 12-3, 3-6 and 6-8pm.

This is our largest fund raiser of the year and allows us to purchase eyeglasses, give scholarships, hold our Egg Hunt and many other things needed in our community.
