The Year So Far

We are coming to another end of a Lions year. We have one more month left but we might as well run down some of the highlights of what we have accomplished this year. For a small club of 25 members we sure did a lot.

- We received a donation of 1000 pounds of flour and immediately brought it down to the food bank.
- We paid for six eye exams and arranged for thirteen pair of eyeglasses through our partnership with Lens Crafters
- In concert with the Francis House meals program we fed 456 meals, donated 6000 forks, 5000 cups and an additional 9 gallons of milk other than what we normally provide for our feeds.
- We collected 2230 pair of used eyeglasses for LERC.
- We raised just over \$16000 dollars in our fundraisers and spent almost \$15,000 in the community.
- We provided hearing and vision screening for Cascade Christian School screening 157 students.
- We held two diabetes screenings
- We worked with the Service Clubs of Puyallup holding a Halloween event at the Mall as well as providing labor for a breakfast at the Senior Center..
- Held our annual Easter Egg Hunt for about 75 kids
- Provided for a farewell picnic at Camp Leo cooking hamburgers, hot dogs and providing fresh fruit as well as potato salad.

We had a successful year of serving our community. ON top of this we had two members help outside groups as well. One worked with Habitat for Humanity and the other was a Team Captain For Alaska Airlines for the "Big Climb" benefiting Blood Cancers.

Project News

We need to start looking at new projects to accomplish in the upcoming year. We have cancelled two of our long term fund raisers because they were no longer feasible. The Rose sale was cancelled this year because the supplier was unable to guarantee a stable source of flowers. The Charity rally was cancelled because there was no growth in the project over a ten year run. That and one of our major sponsors was recently sold so our profit margin was greatly reduced. As a result the major funding source for our Foundation and a funding source for our club are no longer available.

We are looking into one project but we have to wait for some outside entities before it is a viable project. Hopefully we will be able to start our trivia nights once the issues with the location are ironed out.

What we are looking for is fund raisers that can bring the club some income that are the one or two day events like our Chili project. That project takes coordination and pre sale of tickets but the actual event is just a one day event. The raffle prizes take some time to gather as well but we can do that throughout the year and save them up for the different events we hold.

Bring your ideas to the planning session on June 9th. If they are not fleshed out yet just bring a bare bones idea and we can maybe flesh them out in the coming months. I know there are great ideas out there,

Other things we are looking for are ways to do something for the environment as well as getting more involved with Francis House and the Food Bank, Any ideas in these areas are welcome as well.




